22.122	Minutes from the last meeting were not approved. PF was unhappy with the fact there were two sets of minutes and the shortened version to approve were inaccurate. SK explained the minutes were not verbatim and had to be shortened to exclude comments made in open forum. PF agreed to email SK with the points he felt were missing	
22.123	NO declarations of interest were made	
22.124	Open Forum. AJ had 3 points. 1 There is a COL scheme with grants for helping the community. 2 she has met the Police and wants Parishes to share crime intelligence. 3 She has a thermal imaging camera which can be used to expose insulation defects. A MOP also has one. NAK had 5 points. 1 Can the PC write to Aster to complain about the extortionate sewerage charges being levied on houses in Carters Clay, Oval Road and East Dean Road. Some residents' bills are 10 times normal. Caroline Nokes is aware. 2 There is a HCC consultation on Mineral Extraction. Nearby areas affected are Gardeners Lane/Rydown Lane towards Ower. NAK said the traffic would be severe. 3 Lockerley School OFFSTED result was OK. Test Valley School Stockbridge struggling due to lower numbers. 4 If you want to complain about road matters, go on the HCC website to report it, get a reference number and then NAK can follow up. 5 Ditches are a problem but the budget is limited and summer takes up road repairs and Autumn is hedges and Ditches. The recent wet weather has made flooding inevitable. Major problems must be reported on the web site. The "lengthsman" scheme does not apply to ditches.	
22.125	Village Greens Policy has been drafted. PF wanted to get Parish feedback before it is formally adopted. Agreed to publish the draft on the web site and Facebook etc.	Action PF
22.126	PA explained that a recent request to use the field as ancillary to a wedding event would be a breach of the lease from the Diocese. The field is for games and recreation generally. The Scouts do not have a sublease but can use it for recreation.	
22.127	JW gave a detailed breakdown of the work she has done on the Footpaths, ditches, playground etc and proposed remedial works. Shackles Lane – suggest we write to the landowner and then HCC. Glebe Field and Playground hedges to be cut by Clive Jones for £120 + VAT. Report is attached. JW also produced a report of who is responsible for a range matters. Report attached.	Action ??
22.128	PA outlined the Village Design Statement (VDS) is a plan for how Lockerley should develop. Better to have a Community Neighbourhood Plan which TVBC "must" take into account, rather than a VDS which can be ignored. Three exploratory meetings have taken place and a public	

	meeting where TVBC will outline more detail has been scheduled for the 14 December. PF said this was not valid as it has not been authorised by LPC. PA explained the meeting was not a PC meeting but an initial Parish meeting to hear more about the subject. NAK explained that any costs would be reimbursed by TVBC.	
22.129	SK went through the latest financial position as far as is known. She explained that bank statements go to a former Clerk and are not forwarded. TSB seem unable to accept a mandate change request. The available cash resource is circa £34,000 plus some restricted funds for LGPS and LCFE?. PF pointed out an error in the accounts which refers to a Covid Grant whereas he had been informed it was a gift. Agreed that TC/PA/SK will investigate this. Payments to authorise were as follows HALC subscription £342.22 P Webb for notes of mtg £75 British Legion £25 for remembrance day wreath Lockerley Village Hall £48 for hire of rooms C Jones for hedgecutting £120 + VAT PF objected to a payment of £96 for SK's attendance at the NALC AGM and conference. It was not passed for payment. It was clear TSB are delivering appalling service and it was recommended we change banks to Unity. An MOP question on security of the bank was answered by the FSCS Government protection to which Unity is registered.
